

Time Capsule

To make a time capsule you will need a container to place all of your items in. Your container needs to be strong and watertight (something that will not biodegrade) and big enough for all of your memorabilia. We would love to see pictures of you guys making and burying your time capsules on our school's Facebook page!

Here are some ideas for items to include in your time capsule:

You could ask your family member to write a letter, or keep a diary for a week and include it in your capsule. Remember to include dates and names.

There is a booklet on the school's home learning page you could complete and include in your capsule.

Photos of your family, friends, pets, favourite places to visit. Don't forget to write the date on the back of the pictures and a description of who or what the picture is of.

You could write a letter to your future self explaining:

- What you have been doing during the last few months.
- Describing your favourite memory.
- What your hopes and dreams are for the future.
- Describing your best friend.
- Describing your family.
- Describing your school.

You could include some cuttings from newspapers or print articles from the recent weeks.

You could also include:

- A 2020 postage stamp
- A 2020 dated coin.
- Pressed flowers
- Painted stones
- A government leaflet or letter.

You could draw and label your family tree.

Drawings of your favourite toys/things with a description of how they work and why you like them.

Once you have finished a buried your capsule, you could make a map of its location. It would be great to keep these at school ready for future generations to discover.
